Dear Parent/Carer

I am writing to you again to update you on some information regarding Year 12 students (Year 13 from September).

Year 13 will return to school on Monday 6th September.

Parents' Evening

We recognise that this year has been challenging and, at times, uncertain for students and parents. We hope that things will look a little more 'normal' next year and this will include a Parents' Evening early in the Autumn Term (Thursday 14 October) to allow parents and students to have some helpful feedback early on. This week we ran a successful pilot with Year 7 using an online platform for Parents' Evening so we are confident that these will go ahead next year, be it in person or online.

ID Cards / Arriving to School

From September, at the start of the day students will be able to use any gate that is convenient for them and will register with their Form Tutor when they arrive in the morning as normal. If students are entering/leaving the school at any other time during the day, they need to use the Aneurin Way entrance. They should use their ID Cards to enter/exit via the pedestrian gate and sign in using one of the machines on site. **Students must keep their cards safe for use in Year 13**.

Attendance

During the Autumn Term, students may need to attend University Open Days / taster sessions. If this is the case, I would be grateful if you could let us know via email to Mrs Platt (jpt@olchfa.org.uk) so that we can record the absence correctly. I would also like to take this opportunity to remind you that, if a student is absent, a parent/carer should contact the school on each day of the absence (01792 534300 or by email to Mrs Platt). Students are reminded that attendance to all lessons (other than an authorised absence) is compulsory and good attendance is a requirement of remaining in the Sixth Form.
